


Easily put a frame or border around your embroidery design.

- Use the border and motif underline tools to create simple borders using satin, triple or motif stitches

| <p>1.</p> | <p>Open mySewnet Embroidery. Choose Blank Canvas. In the Hoop Selection pop-up choose 240mm x 150mm Hoop. Orientation Rotated. Click OK</p> |  |
| <p>2.</p> | <p>Go to the Letter Tab and choose the Font Bernie 25-40mm in the Retro category and type in "Created with Love 2021" in three rows</p> |  |
| <p>3.</p> | <p>Set the size to 18mm and the Alignment to Center. Click Apply</p> |  |

| <p>4.</p> | <p>Right click and choose Edit Lettering. Change the gap to -3 to move the letters closer together. This is also where you can change the size, shape and formatting of your lettering. Click OK.</p> |  |
| <p>5.</p> | <p>Make sure the Lettering is marked and Go to the Frame Tab. Choose Flourish and the Crown in Ornamental 3 Category.</p> |  |
| <p>6.</p> | <p>Choose Flourish Option Above and leave the Margin to 2,5mm. Click Apply</p> |  |
| <p>7.</p> | |  |
| <p>8.</p> | <p>Add a frame with appliqué by choosing the rectangle frame in the appliqué Shields category. Leave the margin at 2.5mm and click apply.</p> |  |

| <p>9.</p> | <p>Your design is automatically combined and ready to be stitched out.</p> |  |
| <p>10.</p> | <p>If you have a mySewnet enabled machine, you can send the design directly to the machine Screen, ready to be stitched out. The send options can be found in the top right corner of the screen.</p> |  |
| <p>11.</p> | <p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p> |  |
| <p>12.</p> | <p>If you want a different format you use the Export instead. Here you will get a list of</p> |  |

| <p>13.</p> | <p>Here you will get a list of all available formats and you can choose the format you need for your embroidery machine.</p> |  |
| <p>14.</p> | <p>On the Export pop-up you also get additional choices under Optimize for Sewing. These are settings you can change in Configure.</p> |  |
| <p>15.</p> | <p>If you open Configure under the File menu and the Export Tab you can select your options. Removing the checkmarks for Combine and Color Sort helps if you want to decide when to do that manually before Export.</p> <p>This is very useful when working with Appliqué designs where you want to keep the number of color blocks for the technique steps.</p> <p>When you have made the changes click Apply and OK.</p> |  |

16. Under File and Print, you will get the option to print a template. This is perfect if you want to experiment with the placement or see how the design aligns.

Make sure the Design Scale is set to 100%

You can choose what information you want on your template by checking/unchecking the boxes under Print Information.
