Tips & Hints For Embroidering Fur

One material that makes the Holidays feel luxurious is fur/faux fur. Below are tips for how to embroider onto fur for your next project.

Embroidering on Fur

- 1. One challenge with fur is hooping it, so the best solution is to not actually hoop it. For fur, it's best to hoop your stabilizer and then use a basting stitch to keep the fabric in place. *Tip: If your embroidery machine is compatible with the metal hoops, these are a great solution for any hard-to-hoop projects like fur/faux fur.*
- 2. When hooping or attaching your fur to the hoop, place a "topper" water soluble stabilizer over the fur. This is a thin layer, but it helps keep your embroidery on top of the fur rather than getting lost in the fur.

Note: When removing this stabilizer, tear off as much as you can to avoid needing to use water to actually remove all the stabilizer. This helps keep the fur tidy.

- 3. If you have fur that is longer than 1/4" (1cm) you may want to consider trimming some of it down afterwards if it hangs over your embroidery.
- 4. When choosing your design, make sure it is a bold, filled-in design or font. More delicate designs will be hard to see.
- 5. Use a new sharp needle, size 75/11 or 80/12.

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
