
“Draw” your own stitch paintings.



- Draw freehand or straight lines of stitches using running stitches, triple stitches or satin lines
- Use the Motif Line tool to draw using your favorite machine stitch motifs
- Embroider your signature or use the calligraphy feature to create monograms



1.	To use stitches is a great way of enhancing details in a picture and get a 3D effect.	
2.	Open a blank canvas and choose a 150x150mm Hoop, Orientation Natural.	
3.	Go to the Create Tab and Sketch	



<p>4.</p>	<p>This will load a pop-up with different options</p>	
<p>5.</p>	<p>Load a picture ready to create a new design. Draw stitches for embroidery onto the picture, once the picture has been printed or transferred onto fabric. Alternatively, use the picture simply as a background image guide.</p>	
<p>6.</p>	<p>Load an existing embroidery to be edited or completed. Use this to continue working on a previous design, to load a previously finished design for printing to combine a picture with any embroidery.</p>	
<p>7.</p>	<p>Start a completely new embroidery with no background picture.</p>	
<p>8.</p>	<p>Click the first option to Load Picture for a New Embroidery. Click Next</p>	
<p>9.</p>	<p>Change to a 150x150mm Hoop, Orientation Natural. Click Next</p>	


<p>10.</p>	<p>Here you choose which background picture you want to use;</p> <p>Load a picture - Find the picture you want to use in your folders.</p> <p>Paste Picture - If you previously Copied the picture.</p> <p>From Scanner or Camera - Find your source and open picture.</p> <p>Create New Picture - This will open the Draw & Paint module and you can create a new picture.</p> <p>Edit Picture - Will become available when a picture is chosen and you have the possibility to edit.</p>	<p>Choose Picture</p> 
<p>11.</p>	<p>Choose load a picture</p>	
<p>12.</p>	<p>Find the picture you want to enhance with stitches. The umbrella picture is available in the article.</p> <p>Click OK</p>	

<p>13.</p>	<p>Click Next</p>	
<p>14.</p>	<p>In the next step, you can zoom and crop your image by clicking on the blue corners. To the left is the original image and to the right a Preview of the changes.</p> <p>You can also rotate, Crop and change perspective. If you are making a lot of changes it can be good to save the image before proceeding.</p> <p>Click Next</p>	
<p>15.</p>	<p>In the next step, you can choose to adjust the size to be smaller in the hoop. (It cannot be larger)</p> <p>Click First Thread Button, then click a color in the picture that you wish to use as the first thread color.</p> <p>We will use the default blue color to get some contrast.</p> <p>Click Next</p>	<p>Load Design Wizard - Picture Size</p> <p>Picture Size</p> <p>Zoom</p>  <p>Picture Height</p> <p>150 mm</p> <p>First Thread Color</p>

<p>16.</p>	<p>In this step you will choose the type of alignment stitches you want to use.</p> <p>Place crosses on picture - Choose manually where to put the crosses</p> <p>Automatic Corners - Automatically get stitches in each corner of the picture.</p> <p>Choose None if you will use an embroidery that already have alignment stitches or use a placement feature in your embroidery machine.</p>	
<p>17.</p>	<p>When you click Finish, the Sketch window opens.</p> <p>We will use the tools on the right hand side where you can choose the color and what type of stitch you want to use.</p>	

<p>18.</p>	<p>Click on the Color select list and choose a metallic silver thread.</p>	
<p>19.</p>	<p>Choose the triple stitch and click on Options</p>	
<p>20.</p>	<p>A pop-up will open to set the length of the stitch. Set it to 3.0mm Click OK</p>	
<p>21.</p>	<p>In this image we will highlight the umbrella and we want straight lines. Choose the straight line tool</p>	

<p>22.</p>	<p>Place the lines where you want them.</p>	
<p>23.</p>	<p>You can also zoom in to create smaller details. Like the cuffs in this image</p>	
<p>24.</p>	<p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p>
